ELCC Safety & Well Being Policy (Protocol)

The following should be announced at the beginning of each in-person service (before we go live).

As we return to in-person services, we want to make sure that everyone feels safe, and comfortable during worship. In order to accomplish this, we need your help.

To ensure a safe and clean environment, all in-person service attendees are strongly encouraged to adhere to the precautions outlined below.

- If you have not been fully vaccinated (COVID-19), you must wear a face mask at all times. However, you are NOT required to wear a face mask if you've been fully vaccinated.
- If you have been diagnosed with the flu, COVID-19, or any other sickness that can be passed from person-to-person, you must be at least 7 days removed from the diagnosis to attend service. You must wear a mask when attending service until you are 10 days removed from positive COVID diagnosis. This means you've tested negative for COVID or a doctor has given you a clean bill of health and cleared you for normal activities.
- If you have a fever of 100 or higher, please do not attend service until your temperature has dropped below 100. ELCC may check your temperature If and when required by the Centers for the Disease Control (CDC) or State and Local authorities; or at times deemed necessary by ELCC's Leadership Team.
- When sneezing, please use the inside elbow of your arm, and turn away from individuals. Be sure to wash your hands and use the Lysol, hand sanitizer, and sanitizer spray provided throughout the facility.

Since the flu, respiratory syncytial virus (RSV), and Coronavirus (COVID-19) can start without a fever, we HIGHLY recommend that you take extra precautions when deciding whether or not to attend in-person service. If you are not feeling well, we encourage you to remain home, and recommend you see your primary physician.

If you test positive for COVID within 5 days **after** attending a live ELCC service, we ask that you notify ELCC leadership team immediately. You can do this by e-mailing EverLast092109@yahoo.com or using the Contact Form on our website. The ELCC leadership team will notify members and visitors who attended the live service to encourage them to be tested, and to decrease further exposure.

Everlasting Life Christian Church has provided complimentary masks, hand sanitizer, and sanitizer spray throughout the facility. Please use at your leisure.

Remember, in order to attend our weekly services, you must RSVP as seating is limited. Reservations are a first come first serve basis.
